SERMON – SCOTT KOOP

1 Corinthians 13 is known as the love chapter and it is a spectacular example of what true godly love really is. It's something that we as followers of Jesus ought to aspire to. Most of the time, however, we focus on verses 4 through 7 and we leave out verses 1 through 3 and verses 8 through 13.

In the first section of this chapter, we are given some rationale for why love is vital to our lives. The author states that no matter our abilities or how much good we might do, if it is not done from a place of love that it will count for nothing. The interesting thing is that speaking all the languages of earth and of angels, having all knowledge and a faith that can move mountains. Giving up everything, even one's own life, is a description of what Jesus did and what He does. And Jesus did all of it solely from a place of love.

Of course, verses 4 through 7 is the most well known section of this chapter and is the description of what love is and what it looks like. This is the model that we need to strive for. This is the model that Christ displayed perfectly.

In the last section–verses 8 through 13–we have a beautiful picture of what is to come. Two ideas that I wish to highlight here are 1. That love will last forever, and 2. That perfection is coming. Another word that can be used in place of perfection here is completeness.

When Jesus comes again He will bring His kingdom into being and all that is imperfect and incomplete will be done away with. And love is what will ultimately bring this eternal kingdom to fruition. Love will last forever because heaven, paradise, living in the presence of the triune God is forever. It will never end.

Of all the things that will last forever–faith, hope and love–may we be those who exemplify well the greatest of them all. May we live out the example of God's love to the world around us. Amen.
