#### CREATIVE PRAYER – PASTOR MIKAYLA

At youth, we have been going through a series about prayer. We have talked about the basic concept of prayer—why it is important, asking whether God listens or not, and more. We had time to look at the Lord's Prayer and how it can be more than a memorized paragraph, but an active part of our prayer life.

More recently we are looking at some creative ways to pray to God. Last week I tried something I wasn't so sure about. I played a song (maybe more familiar to the younger generation) called "God Be" by Chris Renzema. I gave each kid a page with the lyrics and after we had listened to the song, I encouraged them to create their own prayers based on lines or words from the song. Sometimes I worry that these more abstract concepts won't make sense to the kids, but I believe it is important to explore the many ways we can connect with God.

With some feedback in our small groups afterwards I was encouraged, but a few days later I saw some students had given their paper back to me and had written on them. All of them were anonymous, but one person had written this on their page: "Dear God, I prayed to you for a long time, asking for peace, hope and a home. After you gave it to me I started to know that for my peace I need you, for my hope I need you, and for my home I need church and you."

I was amazed at how they used the lyrics, but added their own words and thoughts to the prayer. This exercise reminded me that God works within many things. He can work in the contemporary Christian music kids listen to. He can work through the creative minds of youth. And He certainly works through earnest prayer to Him, just as I saw in these words this kid wrote.

This can encourage each of us to see God in creative ways. Let us use the songs we know well as the beginnings of new prayers. May we not be afraid to talk to God through the words of a poetic melody. If we believe God to be all powerful, we must know that He can be at the other side of a musical prayer to Him.

It is my belief that we are creative because we are made in God's image—the one who is the most creative in all the universe. I believe He hears the innovative words of this student and smiles, seeing their unique prayer based on this song. May we each explore our creative ways of prayer, however that may look to each of us.
