THE SAME ATTITUDE AS CHRIST – PASTOR KIM

Last week Mikayla talked about unity in the church and she shared the phrase "sacrificial community." The theme of unity carries into this week's passage as well, but with an emphasis on the importance of the church shining like a bright light in the world.

Paul's words in Philippians 2:3-4 about not being selfish, thinking of others and being humble are just a few ways that we participate in being a sacrificial community. Sometimes it means giving up our personal preferences and not creating waves over things that are really just personal preferences.

Paul took it further in verses 5-8, where he said, Be like Jesus. Have the same attitude that Jesus had.

Right from the start with Adam and Eve, people have wanted control and power. In the garden Adam and Eve disobeyed God and took matters into their own hands. They wanted to be like God. The tension and struggle between God and humanity had begun. When Jesus came to earth, He laid down His status.

The poem or hymn of verses 6-11 has a significant description of Jesus, His identity, His time on earth and the future. We read a description of Jesus, who is God and we read that He loves with a sacrificial love and that through Jesus, God has done what only God can do.

Jesus never stopped being divine, never stopped being equal with God, never stopped being God. His journey to the cross, dying for the sins of humanity was "The perfect self expression of the true God." – N.T. Wright

Jesus abandoned His rights for the sake of the world and we are called to do the same. In verses 12-16, Paul reminds the church how to live out their faith.

Imagine what the world could be like if churches were like lighthouses. Lighthouses are visible from far away. They warn of dangers. They guide people to safety. They shine their light. They are beacons. A beacon is a light that is up high and serves as a warning, a signal or a celebration. The church could and should be that in

our communities. Jesus did say to let our lights shine, not to cover them up.

The world is a beautiful creation, yet we know that because of sin in the world it can be hard to live daily life. The church as a beacon of hope and light can make a difference. The church is to be a group of people living life together in a community that is shaped by the gospel. The gospel is the good news of Jesus Christ. That He came and did not exploit His equality with God, but rather sacrificed His own life, paid the penalty for our sins so that we could be made right with God.

We know that sometimes there are things that we won't all agree on, yet we are to be of one mind and purpose. In other words, make the main thing the main thing: Jesus, who He is, why He came and what that means.

May McIvor Church be a beacon of light in our community. May we be an example of self-sacrificing love and sacrificial community. May we have the same attitude that Christ Jesus had.
